**Flower Darby** is the Associate Director of the Teaching and Learning Center at the University of Missouri as well as an internationally renowned keynote speaker and author. She is also an adjunct faculty at Northern Arizona University and Estrella Mountain Community College. Flower has taught in higher ed for over 25 years in a range of subjects including English, Technology, and Leadership. A seasoned face-to-face and online educator, Flower applies learning science across the disciplines and helps others do the same.

Through her publications and presentations, Flower has helped educators all over the world become more effective in their work. She's the author, with James M. Lang, of *Small Teaching Online: Applying Learning Science in Online Classes*, and she's a regular contributor to *The Chronicle of Higher Education*. Her new book project is on emotion science and teaching with technology.
